## A SPECIAL SERVICE

### Celebrating God's Creation

This special service invites us to listen again to the voice of creation - the sea and the salmon, the lilies and the birds, the sun, moon and wind, the creatures who share our common home. Through ancient song, Scripture and praise, we remember that all life is held in God's hand, and that every living thing becomes our teacher. Today we gather with humility and wonder, giving thanks for the beauty, wisdom and generosity of the world God has made, and renewing our call to cherish it. And we give thanks, too, for the creatures who walk beside us in daily life - our companion animals, who offer loyalty without condition, gentleness without judgement, and a wordless grace that steadies the heart. In their presence we glimpse something of God's own being.

We also honour the wild - the untamed lives of field, sea and forest, shore, marsh and sky, whose freedom reminds us that creation is larger, older and more mysterious than our egoic or parochial concerns. Together, the domestic and the wild call us into deeper kinship with all that lives, and into a humbler, more joyful stewardship of God's world.

And so we come with gentle steps - the kind that honour the ground beneath us and the lives that share it. To walk gently is to remember that every creature is a neighbour, every patch of earth a gift, every moment an invitation to tread with care. In this spirit, we move through God's world lightly, gratefully, and with a tenderness that lets creation flourish around us.
